Butts Criminal: Suppression motion; DUI arrest; voluntariness of consent for blood draw; duty to make defendant aware of all consequences of his consent; intoxication as affecting voluntariness of consent; right to speak to an attorney before consent decision; duty to advise of constitutional right to refuse blood test; coercion.
